

**CONSENT AND CHECKLIST FORM  
FOR TRAVELLERS ENTERING MALAYSIA  
UNDER DEATH AND CRITICALLY ILL EMERGENCY VISITS (DCEV)**

As an applicant for Death and Critically Ill Emergency Visit (DCEV), I undertake to complete the following procedures and requirements:

- i. Read and understand all terms and conditions as stipulated and published in Department of Immigration Malaysia's website, under MyTravelPass System page at (<https://mtp.imi.gov.my/myTravelPass/main?termConditionDCEV>).
- ii. Perform COVID RT-PCR swab test 72 hours prior to departure to Malaysia and produce a valid negative RT-PCR test result for verification by the officer/authority at the international point of entry.
- iii. Produce all the necessary documents i.e. entry approval for compassionate reason from Johor/Selangor Health Department, documents to prove a familial connection, death certificate or any documents as proof of death of a family member (for death cases) or doctor's letter to support critically ill cases (for critically ill cases), and other supporting documents.
- iv. Undergo the COVID RTK-Ag swab test at the international point of entry.
  - a. If the result is positive, the applicant will be referred to the hospital.
  - b. If the result is negative, the applicant will be escorted/sent to the designated quarantine station.
- v. Pay all costs including COVID-19 swab test, quarantine charges, hospital charges (if referred) and any other logistical charges. Additionally, all applicants shall pay in full a one-off mandatory entry charge of RM2,600.00. Waiver of the mandatory one-off entry charge will only be given to Malaysian Citizens.
- vi. All visit program and arrangement shall be cancelled if the applicant is found to be unwell.
- vii. For hospital visit, approval must be obtained from the Hospital Director / Management prior to the visit. Depending on the prevailing hospital's visitation policy, applicants may not be allowed to enter the hospital without an approval letter, even if the applicant have obtained permission to enter Malaysia under DCEV.
- viii. Transport to the declared emergency destination (hospital or funeral place) will be arranged by the staff at the quarantine station and the cost is to be borne by the applicants. Applicants are to travel in the designated transport and to be escorted by a staff (Civil Defence Force) from the quarantine station to the declared emergency destination.
- ix. Applicants are not allowed to detour or go to any place other than the emergency destination. Applicants are only granted a one-off, 3-hour (maximum) visit at the declared emergency destination (not including travel time).

- x. Upon completion of the visit, applicants will return to the quarantine station and immediately leave for Singapore. Failing to do so, applicants will be subjected to the prevailing immigration and health policies of Malaysia and shall bear all additional cost incurred.

I shall undertake and comply with the procedures and requirements as stated above, and verily understand that I am still subjected to the prevailing health policy and prevailing immigration procedures of Malaysia. Any non-compliance with the procedures and requirements will result in my application for Death and Critically Ill Emergency Visit (DCEV) to be cancelled by the authorities in Malaysia.

I further undertake to indemnify and hold the Government of Malaysia, its employees and agents harmless from and against all actions, proceedings, losses, shortfalls, damages, compensation, costs (including legal costs), charges and expenses resulting from my actions, negligence or dishonesty.
